EHAC Clubmen and Leaguers Abroad European Cup for Race Walking

Making his GB debut in the junior 10km at the European Cup for Race Walking staged in Murcia, Spain on 17th May, Callum Wilkinson set a pb which lifted him into Europe's top dozen juniors. His time of 42.49 (previous best 44.15) also bettered the selection qualifying time for the European junior track & field championships being held in Sweden in July.

Covering the first km in 4.22 Wilkinson occupied 25th position in the 43 strong field. By 5km reached in 21.27 he had improved to 17th and walking the second half of the race slightly faster than the first (21.22) finished a very creditable twelfth.

Spaniards Diego Garcia in 40.38 and Pablo Oliva 41.19 finished first and third split by Frenchman Jean Blancheteau 41.11.

European Masters Non-Stadia championships

Meanwhile, over in Grosseto, Italy, Arthur Thomson (M75) was winning individual and team 30km gold and individual 10km bronze medals in the Euro Masters non stadia championships with times of 3.38.26 and 64.01. The women's distances were 10km and 20km. The temperature was in the 30's and the course offered no shade, so conditions were particularly difficult especially for the 30km.

Leaguers at the championships were to the fore in their events. Cath Duhig (W60) 63.58 earned a silver, whilst John Hall (M65) 56.33/3.28.12 collected two bronze and a team gold. Ken Bobbett (M70) 63.37 also collected a bronze and Dave Kates (M65) 15th 65.18/10th 3.45.54 a team gold. There were notable performances by Malcolm Martin (M60) 7th - 58.22/4th - 3.07.53, Steve Allen (M55) 6th - 55.52, Andy Cox (M60) 13th - 62.34/9th - 3.42.35 and Angela Martin (W50) 9th - 66.00pb/5th 2.22.44. Steyning's Ian Richards won two individual and a team gold medals.

Thirty-five seniors and six juniors set off on the Pednor 5 miles and two miles races around the picturesque, but challenging course. Fabian Deuter virtually led from start to finish clocking 42.44. He was followed in the early stages by a group consisting of Steve Allen, John Hall, Keith Vallis and John Ralph with Steve Uttley not far behind them. By the steep climb just past the two mile point the group began to spread out and John Ralph had to give ground and was passed by Steve Uttley. Meanwhile, Steve Allen reached the top and secured his runner-up position, eventually putting just over a minute between himself and John Hall. The race incorporated the Bucks championship and was won by John Ralph ahead of Alan Roberts

The first three ladies; Helen Middleton and Hillingdon duo Jo Miles and Jenny Middleton finished in the same order as their positions in the *League*.

George Bancroft (Hawridge & Cholsbury School) and Talien van Kuijk (Chiltern H) 24.17 were the 2wo mile junior winners.

A five mile run follows the walk and trophies awarded for the woman and man with the fastest combined times. There were four women and four men who took on the challenge this year and the winners were Melanie Bolden 106.02 (61.58/44.04) and Keith Vallis 82.37 (46.29/36.08).
