The course was 5k, on a new route, and was staged in accordance with the present COVID-19 regulations applying to athletics, race walking, and the local park authorities.

Leaguers in the race were: Dave Annetts 1st/24.07, Stuart Bennett 6th/32.19, Maureen Noel 7th/33.01, Fiona Bishop 8th/33.12, Lesley Morris 9th/34.11 and Chris Flint 10th/38.41. The four other athletes who raced were familiar names from the VERWL; David Kemp 2nd/26.36, Ian Torode 3rd/26.41, Grazia Manzotte 4th/28.44 and Silvana Alves 5th/30.17. *Full report and pictures on the VAC web-site.*

There was a 5km track walk in the **AFD Open Meeting** on Monday 31st May. The race winner in 21.29.21 was the poromoting club's Christopher Snook in what looked a close race, ahead of Manx Harrier Tom Partington 21.36.49, whilst in third place slicing half a minute off his pb was George Wilkinson 21.18.54. Five men and six women took part, the leading lady being Abigail Jennings (AFD) in 25.18.27. There were two dq's

After winning the GB Olympic trial at Kew in March, **Callum Wilkinson needed the Olympic qualifying time** to guarantee his place and Join Tom Bosworth in the 20km team for Tokyo. At the International Cantones De A Corunia meeting on 5th June he did just that with a sixth place finish in 80.32. The race was won by Spaniard Diego Garcia Carrera in 79.37. Other Brits in the race were Tom Bosworth 81.37/14th and Cameron Corbishley 86.37/51st. Heather Lewis 95.48/20th and Bethan Davies 99.23/32nd. in the women's 20km

Ultra-Distance exploits The weekend of 29th/30th May was one for the ultra-distance walkers; It was the LDWA 100 and Leaguer Kevin Marshall and former club member Sue Clements kindly sent in these accounts of their walks.

Sue c950 wrote: This year the annual LDWA 100 miles was cancelled, and members were invited to take part in a virtual challenge instead. They could walk any route of their choosing provided they could produce evidence of completing 100 miles non-stop. Claire Bass and I walked the LDWA Virtual 100 miles by walking two circuits of a route based on the 50 mile PATHFINDER MARCH, a challenge walk that RAF Wyton have organised in the past. We walked two laps plus of the Pathfinder plus to complete a final distance of 100.11 miles in 34h 52m. Joyce Crawford provided invaluable support and encouragement by walking some of the route with us each day. Claire and Joyce's husbands met us at various locations around the course with a dazzling array of refreshments. A weekend of many lovely memories.

We walked the Millennium Way which runs from Pershore to Meriden and then back down to Middleton Cheney near Banbury. We had a GPS tracker with us so they knew where we were and when we were likely to turn up. They even had a welcoming party at the finish to greet us. It was such an amazing experience.
