

Seventh Fixture Comment from former SE Walking Captain Andy Tweed.

I wonder if I can be cheeky and enter as a guest this month's Enfield league.

I get the Enfield Walker and I see so many names I remember from my race walking days still competing and it made me wonder if I can still do it. My last race must be 25 years ago when I made a 'come back' but was pulled for bent knees. A devastating experience having driven a 200 mile round trip to take part. It made me switch to marathon running.

In recent years I've done stuff on two wheels, although I've never competed, I've enjoyed some long rides. But best of all I loved my days as one time captain for the Stock Exchange AC walking section at a time when the club was thriving. Great days!

Anyway. Armed with my gps app on a glorious morning on Frinton sea front I did an out and back to Walton, 5k in 36.11 which I was rather pleased about even if it is 10 minutes slower than what I could do in 1973. Mind you, race walking 5k with no training after all these years killed my legs for several days, so probably best not attempt 7 miles from scratch.

I've been a 'virtual' voyeur of the race walking scene for years now thanks to Tony Perkins (Essex Walkler) and Ron and was sad not to have been able to turn up for the Enfield 7 'Big' anniversary which I'd had hoped to do. Always a favourite event in my day and the start of the 7 mile season.

Had it not been virtual, walking again would have stayed a fantasy in my mind.

Leaguers in Action To qualify for Leaguer Status an athlete must participate in a six ERWL fixtures in a calendar year.

The second of the **VETS AC Summer Series** at Battersea Park on 8th June had a smaller field with idyllic spring weather, with large sections in the shade it looked like PB territory, and it was. The course was 5k again, and the race walk was the only event, which was actually a race, as the accompanying running race had wave starts, due to compliance with the present COVID-19 regulations.

Fast finishing Dave Annetts (N Herts Road Runners) 24.40 went into a clear lead followed by Stuart Bennett (Ilford AC). Grazia Manzotti (Tonbridge AC)28.35 had a second win at this event finishing strongly and also a new PB, but this time she had to work hard to avoid being overtaken by ever improving Melanie Peddle 29.06 from Loughton AC, who also gained a PB as did Tom Casserley (Enfield AC) 34.52.. Other Leaguers in the race besides Dave, Melanie and Tom were Stuart Bennett 32.07, Maureen Noel 32.44, Fiona Bishop 33.22 and Lesley Morris 34.12

Peter Cassidy reports that there was a good start to the **Woodford Tuesday 3km track Walks** as they emerge from their Covid imposed absence on 16th June. Fifteen of the 18 that entered turned out on a warm evening that produced some good, close racing. The second of this year's abbreviated three-race series will be at 8.30pm on Tuesday 27th July at Ashton Playing Fields.

Luc Legon (Bexley) 12.40 and Hannah Hopper (Cambs H) 15.58 were the respective winners, Whilst Leaguers in the race were Dave Annetts 14.44, Melanie Peddle 16.02, Steve Crane 16.17, Stuart Bennett 19.25, Lesley Morris 19.51, Geraldine Legon 21.45 and John Borgars who didn't meet with the judge's approval.

In the **England u23 and u20 10km championships** staged at Bedford on 20th June there were only six starters, three women and three men, and sadly with two dq's only four finished. However, on the upside the four title winners all set pb's among them Leaguer Millie Morris (Ashford AC) 55.16.54. The others were the Aldershot AFD duo of Abigail Jennings 52.10.83/Wu23 and Chris Snook 44.45.98/u23 and Akash Nandwani (Leeds U) 53.56.87/u20.

Over the years these championships have not had the greatest of support, put down mainly to the clash with the exam season for these younger age groups. Perhaps this time it was the Covid restrictions.

A week later at Manchester in the **British 5km championships** Mille posted yet another pb in 5th/ 27.24.26. Jacqueline Benson set a season's best in 9th/28.48.14 whilst George Wilkinson was well below his best in 5th/23.58.59.

Also, on Sunday 27th June the **BM (South) track 5km championship** was staged at Horspath. Leaguers made up half the eight strong field. M55 Dave Annetts 1st/25.08.9, W50 Melanie Peddle 1st/27.53.3, M65 Graham Chapman 1st/30.28..6 and W70 Noel Blatchford 1st/34.50. The other finishers in the race were W50 Grazia Manzotte 2nd/ 28.47.4 and W40 Carolyn Derbyshire 2nd/28.49.2.
